Our guest speaker was Myno Van Dyke who is the President of the Newcastle Village & District Historical Society. His topic was The Masseys, a prominent family in the Village of Newcastle. The Massey family originally immigrated in the early 1800's to Vermont, then Watertown, and finally to Grafton, Ontario in the early 1800's. Once in Grafton, Daniel Massey started acquiring land in the area prior to the War of 1812. St. Anne's Spa is now located on the site of their original homestead. Daniel brought back a mechanical thresher to aid in cultivating his acreage in Haldimand Township from Watertown where his girlfriend lived. The family moved to Bond Head where Daniel partnered with Richard Vaughan who owned the local foundry and made ploughs and wheelbarrows. With his business flourishing, Daniel moved to Mill Street in Newcastle and bought land nearby for a factory, and space to house workers. Daniel continued to buy patents for farm equipment, improved on them and then relabeled them with the Massey name. In fact, Napoleon ordered many of Massey's self-binding machines after they received recognition at the Paris Expo. But soon Newcastle was not big enough for Massey with no railway, no lighting, not enough workers and no more land for expansion so he moved his plant to King Street in Toronto. As a result, Newcastle suffered. Without work the population declined. Massey, however, continued to grow by acquiring other businesses. Massey became Massey-Harris, then Massey-Ferguson. The old plant in Newcastle remained empty until 1916 when J. Anderson Smith bought it to make ammunition cases. After the war and until 1998 the factory, now called JASCO Manufacturing, made jewellery boxes and silverware cases. Part of the factory still stands today with the Massey name proudly displayed. There are 14 apartments on the second floor and several businesses below. Another lasting legacy in Newcastle is the Community Hall that Massey donated to the town in 1923. In fact, throughout Newcastle you can see street names relating to the Massey family, the house on Mill Street that he built for his daughter and the Newcastle United Church also built by Massey. Two other wellknown descendants of the original Masseys are Raymond Massey (1896-1983) best known for his acting roles in Dr. Kildare and Lincoln, and Vincent Massey (1952-1957)

who was the first Canadian born Governor General of Canada.
